Directions:

From the North: Take I-35 to US Highway 190 West on the south side of Belton. Proceed to Killeen and exit State Highway (SH) 195. Proceed south on SH 195 to Clear Creek Road (also FM 205), about 3.5 miles from the SH 195 exit. Proceed west on Clear Creek/FM 205 to Maxdale Road, about 1.1 miles. Turn left (south) on Maxdale Road and proceed to the entrance to PHR, about 3.1 miles. As you approach the PHR entrance, you'll see a bright yellow fence on your right. The entrance to PHR is on your right.

From the South/Southeast: Take I-35 north from Austin. Take the exit for State Highway 195, heading north, and proceed for approximately 23 miles. Just after you cross the Lampasas River, turn left (west) on Farm Road 2670. Proceed 3.6 miles to Maxdale Road, where you turn right. Proceed 2.4 miles to the entrance to PHR, which is on the left.

From Southwest: Proceed north on US 281 to Lampasas. Turn right (east) on US 190 to Killeen, then right (south) on SH 195. Proceed south on SH 195 to Clear Creek Road (also FM 205), about 3.5 miles from the SH 195 exit. Proceed west on Clear Creek/FM 205 to Maxdale Road, about 1.1 miles. Turn left (south) on Maxdale Road and proceed to the entrance to PHR, about 3.1 miles. As you approach the PHR entrance, you'll see a bright yellow fence on your right. The entrance to PHR is on your right.

TRAILS:

Terrain is varied, including some moderate hills and, weather permitting, small water crossings and lovely waterfalls. Though efforts have been made to avoid the rockiest areas, there will be some rocky spots, so **hoof protection is strongly advised**. All vet checks will be in camp. Water for horses will be available in camp.

RULES:

Endurance is an athletic event for both horse and rider. The goal is to complete the marked trail within the time given as established by AERC standards with an equine that is fit to continue from checkpoint to checkpoint. Equines must pass a complete vet check before, during, and after the ride. All AERC rules will apply. Safety helmets are recommended for all riders, but are required for juniors at any time they are on their equine, in camp or on trail. Junior riders must be accompanied by a designated adult sponsor (21 years or older) at all times during the ride. Juniors riding as Seniors must show AERC approval. Dogs must be on leashes at all times. **ALL manure and hay must be cleaned and moved to designated manure areas. NO SPREADING!!**

SCHEDULE:

Ride camp opens at noon on Friday and closes at 10am on Monday. **Friday's schedule:** Registration opens 3pm; Vet checks open 3pm; Pre-ride Meeting starts 7pm. **Hookups:** Some RV hookups (with pens) will be available. These are VERY limited and will be on a first-come, first-served basis. **If you are interested, you must make arrangements for hookups directly through the facility manager, Ona Trubee:**

I agree to take full responsibility for myself and the animals I am riding and/or bring with me to the ride. I hereby agree to hold ride management, all ride personnel, and all property owners/lessees upon whose land the ride is held blameless for any accident, injury or loss and free from all liability of such injury or loss that may occur due to my participation in the ride.
